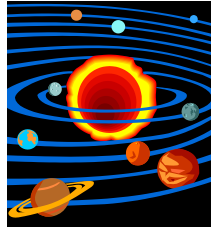


Space Exploration

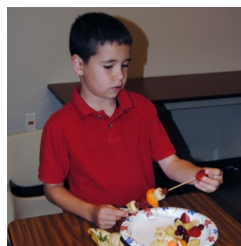
